The HMSA Kaimana Awards & Scholarship Program

■ Program Description

- A three-year sponsorship to fund an annual awards and scholarship program for Hawaii's high schools and their students.
- Will recognize and reward success in four areas:
 - Athletics
 - Sportsmanship
 - Academics
 - Community Service

The HMSA Kaimana Awards & Scholarship Program

- Kaimana Awards
 - Recognizes outstanding all around achievement by a school's student athletes.
- Kaimana Scholarships
 - Provides scholarship opportunities for lower profile sports and students.
- Coaches Education
 - Promotes coaching education and certification.

The HMSA Kaimana Awards

- Kaimana Awards
 - Schools will compete against other schools within their own league and division
 - Scoring criteria will factor in athletics, academics, sportsmanship and community service.
 - HHSAA will coordinate the collection of information with the leagues to identify each winner.

The HMSA Kaimana Awards

- The number of awards provided each year will be dependent on the number of divisions within league.
- For the 2005-2006 school year, there will be ten awards distributed
 - Oahu Interscholastic Association - 3 Awards
 - Interscholastic League of Honolulu - 2 Awards
 - Big Island Interscholastic Federation - 2 Awards
 - Kauai Interscholastic Federation - 2 Awards
 - Maui Interscholastic League - 1 Award

The HMSA Kaimana Awards

- Scoring criteria will be based on four areas
 - Athletics (2 parts)
 - Academics
 - Sportsmanship
 - Community Involvement
- Criteria designed to level the playing field by addressing:
 - Existing differences among league / division rules or situations
 - School size
 - All sports treated equally

The HMSA Kaimana Awards (Academics)

<i>Academics</i>	
If the GPA of all student/athletes on a school team participating in a league recognized sport is:	Points Earned
75% or > have GPA of 3.0 or higher	100
60% or > but < 75% have GPA of 3.0 or higher	80
50% or > but < 75% have GPA of 2.75 or higher	70
75% or > have GPA of at least 2.5 or higher	60
50% or > have GPA of 2.5 or higher	50
75% or > have GPA of 2.0 or higher	40
50% or > have GPA of 2.0 or higher	30

The HMSA Kaimana Awards Sportsmanship

<i>Sportsmanship</i>		
Type of Conduct	Description	Penalty (Points)
Coach's Ejection	For any unsportsmanlike reason	50
Level 1 Conduct	-Any physical altercation with any participant (official, player, fan or other spectator) at an HHSAA sanctioned event -Any incident where a player is ejected from a game for unsportsmanlike conduct	25
Level 2 Conduct	-Any physical damages made by a member of a team to the venue, including furnishings and equipment, or other ancillary facilities or vehicles at the event	10
Level 3 Conduct	-Making obscene comments or gestures at event officials, opposing teams, or fans	5

The HMSA Kaimana Awards

■ Tiebreaker Options:

- If two or more schools within a league are tied, then the school that has the higher score in the following categories will win that league/division award:
 - Academic – Primary tiebreaker
 - Sportsmanship – Second tiebreaker
 - Community Involvement - third
 - Participation - fourth
 - League Championships - fifth

The HMSA Kaimana Scholarships

■ Scholarships

- \$45,000 dedicated towards scholarships
- Focusing on lower profile sports and students (i.e “Rudy” type players)
- Weighted consideration to leadership, community service, academics, effort.
- Twenty-one scholarships/yr evenly distributed between seven leagues for 2005-2006 school year
 - Each scholarship is worth \$2,000
- 3 additional scholarships at the discretion of the committee
 - Bonus scholarships are \$1,000 extra
 - Selected from among the general recipients
 - Announced at the awards luncheon

The HMSA Kaimana Scholarships

- Managed by HHSAA
- Scholarship committee created by HMSA will review applications and select the recipients
- Applications available beginning at 11/1/05 at HMSA, HHSAA, and league websites
- Application deadline for upcoming school year will be 3/31/06
- Scholarship winners will be announced by early May 2006

The HMSA Kaimana Awards & Scholarship Program

- Coaches Education and Certification
 - A portion of sponsorship will be used by HHSAA to help underwrite the cost of materials for the coach's national certification program.
 - Also provide funds to HHSAA to help reimburse coaches for fees paid for CPR training.

The HMSA Kaimana Awards & Scholarship Program

- Coaches Education/Certification
 - In future years, may consider hosting a statewide conference for athletic directors and coaches
 - Sports related educational sessions under one roof
 - Topics may include sports nutrition, training and conditioning, sportsmanship, motivational techniques, and more
 - Opportunity for networking
